- One of the following graphing calculators: **TI-83, TI-83+, TI-84, TI-84+**. (If you already have a different graphing calculator, you may use it but I might not be able to provide assistance with menus, commands, or other functionality.)

Greatly Appreciated Materials: expo markers, tissue, hand sanitizer

Grades: Grades will be calculated categorically. All assignments within the same category will have identical weight unless stated otherwise on the assignment. For example, unless stated otherwise, all homework assignments are weighted equally. Your overall grade for the course will be calculated as follows:

Tests: 50%

Quizzes: 30%

Homework: 20% (Some assignments may actually be completed during class, but they are still considered to be in the Homework category for grading)

Grading Scale: 90% to 100% A
80% to 89.9% B
70% to 79.9% C
60% to 69.9% D
Below 60% F

Attendance: It is imperative that you are present in class to be able to fully understand the material and be successful in my class. For this reason please try to plan vacations and other non-essential occasions during designated school holidays. It is the policy of NPA that **“Students missing 10% or more days per semester may lose credit or be withdrawn.”** This is roughly nine days per semester. If at all possible, students should look over the missed lesson in the online text before returning from an absence. This will make it easier to get caught up when the student returns.

Athletes and Students in Clubs: It is common for students who are absent due to extra curricular events to see a drastic change in their grades. For this reason athletes must meet with me before their absence to determine what they will be

missing and make arrangements as to when homework will be due. Unless other plans are made **before** the absence students are expected to have missed notes copied, both homework assignments completed (the homework that was due the missed day as well as the homework assigned the day they were absent) and to be prepared to take the daily quiz the day they return. Extra curricular activities are a privilege and students must work diligently to keep up on their studies.

Homework:

Each week, expect to have roughly 5 homework assignments that will be completed at home and possibly other classwork assignments that may be completed during class (these are in the Homework category for grading purposes). Homework will always be posted in our Google Classroom which can be accessed through my teacher webpage: www.northlandprep.org/teachers/weston-loucks
Late homework will only be accepted one day late for half credit (for example, an assignment that would have received 80% if submitted on time will receive 40% if it submitted one day late, and 0% if submitted later). Late homework due to an excused absence will be given the same number of days as were missed to be completed (for example, if a student missed 2 days of class they will be granted 2 days to complete all assignments they missed, with the first day back in class counted as the first day).

Answers to past homework assignments will be posted in our Google Classroom. There may be assignments that require you to review the answer key and make corrections. This will be announced in class and posted to Google Classroom if it is required on a particular assignment.

Tests and Quizzes:

Please try to be present on test and quiz days. Absences on these days can result in delayed feedback for other students as answer keys cannot be posted until everyone has completed the assessment. However, if you are ill, please take necessary precautions to ensure the safety of others even if it is on a test or quiz day.

Students who are absent on the day of a test or quiz will be expected to take the assessment within 5 school days, unless otherwise stated, at a time and location to be arranged with the teacher. Test or quizzes missed due to an unexcused absence will result in a zero. Missed daily quizzes will not be able to be retaken and will instead be excused.

Students will be able to retake tests (excluding midterms and finals) with a resulting score that is an average of the two tests up to an 80%. In order to be eligible to take the retake, a student must meet all of the following conditions:

- 1.) Have completed all reviews prior to taking the original test.
- 2.) Complete an extra review after deciding to retake.
- 3.) Meet with the teacher to discuss the original test and the new review. **RETAKES MUST BE COMPLETED WITHIN 5 SCHOOL DAYS OF RECEIVING THE GRADED ORIGINAL TEST.**

Family Link:

Grades will be updated on Infinite Campus in a timely manner. Specifically, larger assignments will be graded within 10 school days and smaller assignments within 5.

Students and parents are encouraged to monitor progress often to maintain a true understanding of the student's progress in the class.

Rules:

Along with the rules and regulations put in place by NPA,

- Be courteous and respectful to others.
- Make effective use of every minute of every class period.
- Cell phones must not be seen during class time. The first offense will result in a verbal warning. Additional offenses may result in more severe consequences including loss of participation points.
- All students are expected to complete their own work. Collaboration with classmates on tests and quizzes will not be permitted unless otherwise stated. A student caught violating this policy, or cheating in any other manner, will receive a zero for the assignment. This includes, but is not limited to, unauthorized assistance from electronic devices.
- Water is allowed in the classroom provided the container has a lid. Students may not have other food or drink in the classroom. Exceptions may be made for students with medical conditions with supporting documentation.
