Course Description:

An intermediate string orchestra class that begins to introduce more advanced concepts to string students including tuning, learning vibrato, beginning to shift to different positions, and playing more difficult music. Students will continue to build their ensemble skills by continuing to play music together in an orchestra setting. Students will also be encouraged to audition for Middle School or High School regionals. Pre-Requisite: Beginning Strings, or prior experience playing a string instrument. Please email Ms. Ahern about experience before joining Concert Strings.

Late Work:

Please communicate with me through email or in person if there is a problem **before** the assignment is due. If there is clear communication about a problem (internet issue, illness in the family, etc.), I will be understanding and work with the student on a case-by-case basis and accept late work without penalty.

However, if there is no communication prior to the due date, I will assume the student forgot to complete the assignment on time and one point will be deducted each day the assignment is late.

Grading:

Grading for this year will be based on the same scale for all quarters. Only the content of the Playing Quizzes will change. These are the approximate values:

Materials Needed for Class:

- Tuner or tuning app (I recommend "Pano Tuner," a free tuning app that is compatible with iOS and Android devices)
- Sheet music
