I am very happy to be able to work with you this year. Each one will work with a variety of art materials and employ many problem solving skills throughout the school year. Emphasizing art history, cultural diversity, artistic style, expression, and art production, students will have the opportunity to make valuable connections across the curriculum. They will also be able to create outstanding projects of their own. I have learned that Art is not merely decoration, but a mode of communication for thoughts, ideas, beliefs, emotions, and more. Through Art we discover the past, celebrate the present, and shape the future!

How can you be successful in this course?

- By listening and following directions
- By knowing and following behavioral expectations
- By producing creative, unique and imaginative work that shows personal style
- By putting forth his/her best effort and best craftsmanship
- By staying focused, completing work on time and including the completed evaluation sheet for each project
- By understanding that mistakes are an essential part of the learning process and applying creative problem-solving skills

Required Materials:

- 1 Two-Pocket Folder
- 2 #2 Non-mechanical pencils
- 1 Bottle of Tacky or Elmer's Glue
- 1 thin black sharpie (Extra Fine or Ultra Fine Point)
- 1 thick/regular black sharpie (Fine Point)
- 1 12" ruler
- 1 pack of 12 or more colored pencils
- 1 pack of 8 or more markers

A portion of these materials will remain in the classroom and the other portion will be your responsibility to bring to class each day.

Course Requirements

- **Class Projects**: These will consist of approximately 70% of your grade. Projects will be completed in 2-3 weeks. You will have the majority of class periods to complete these projects, however if you do not finish in class, you will be responsible for completing projects at home prior to the due date.
- **Assignments:** Assignments will consist of approximately 20% of your grade. Prior to every project, we will learn about art processes and techniques. You will be required to complete assignments that help you learn these techniques and store them in your art folder. You will also complete research-based assignments in your to help you plan themes and concepts for your projects.
- FINAL: Digital Art Portfolio Slide Shows: This assignment will consist of 10% of your grade for both first and second semester. You will document different stages of your projects, track your growth, reflect and set goals for your next project. You will share this slide show with me multiple times throughout the year and receive a grade. This ongoing slide show is also something you will be able to share with your parents. I will give you a template and criteria for you to get started on your portfolio and then you can customize it to reflect your visual interests and personality. Your digital portfolio will include, images of your sketches, stages of your project, additional pictures, videos, written assignment work, evaluation grades, reflections and teacher feedback. This digital portfolio slide show will be considered your final and you will be responsible for completing the majority of it outside of class. This is also the assignment you will work on if you finish other projects or assignments early. The day of the final will include a written assignment that you will include in your digital portfolio.

How do you GRADE in ART class?

This is a common question. Art is a difficult area to "judge" because each project is unique and is based on the artist's creativity and inspiration. Therefore, I will have measurable criteria on which to base the grade.

I will be looking for the following when I grade your work:

- ❖ Did you follow the directions? A lesson plan will be given to you at the beginning of each assignment. It will include a step-by-step description of the procedure. You will also be required to complete a grading evaluation at the end of every project before turning it in. This will include your self-evaluation and my evaluation.
- ❖ Did you take your time? I would extend a class due date to allow you to do QUALITY work, rather than have you rush through and turn in less than your best work.
- ❖ Did you meet the DUE DATE? These dates will be announced and posted in the Art Room. If you need additional time, TALK TO ME prior to the due date so we can work it out!
- ❖ Make sure you keep your sketchbook assignments up to date.
- ❖ Try your best! We will all make mistakes....many of them throughout the year. Take suggestions, make changes, and learn from the mistakes you make.
- ❖ STUDY for quizzes and finals. You will receive study guides and we will review in class. Don't think "it's JUST Art class". You are responsible for learning the information, just as I am responsible for teaching it.

Rules & Responsibilities

- Always clean up after yourself and assist others with cleaning. If there's a mess anywhere, NO ONE will be dismissed.
- Respect your work and be respectful of others work and ideas. NO PUT DOWNS! If it's not a compliment or constructive, do not say it.
- Take responsibility for using your classroom work time wisely and turning in assignments on the due date!
- Immediately read the screen for directions when entering the classroom. Write down due dates and homework in your planner.
- Stay on task and do not disrupt others. Talking quietly at your table is a privilege, not a right. If the noise level is too loud, you will lose talking privileges and may need to receive a new seat.
- Treat materials and equipment with care. Avoid damaging materials and equipment. Leave the room the way you found it.
- Listening to music so that only you can hear it is acceptable on an <u>Ipod or MP3</u> player only during independent work time. **NO listening to music on your phone.** Use is <u>not acceptable</u> during other types of class sessions, especially during lessons. NO MOVIES—NO GAMES!
- Cell Phones are ONLY allowed for learning purposes. I will announce specific purposes in class. Personal/social use is NEVER acceptable in this classroom. This includes texting. Plan to place your phone in the class cubby.
- Snacking and drinking water bottles may occur during class as long as you do not leave a mess. This is a privilege and will end if messes occur.
