Comments on average salary calculation (optional): This represents avg. base salary for instructional staff and does not include amounts for additional duties or CSF 301 performance pay. Returning teachers are receiving an increase of 11% in base plus a \$2000 increase in base from funds previously included within performance pay. Teachers will still receive performance pay. Staff changes have resulted in different salaries for replacement teachers; thus, the overall average salary increase is less than the full 11%.
